

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

REVENUES

Program and other financing resources revenues were \$1,935,690. The chart below reflects revenue by source:


- Program revenue is federal and state reimbursement by Medicaid for direct services provided at the Life Enrichment Center
- County tax revenue is property tax levy established in Callaway County in 1988 to support individuals with developmental disabilities
- Earnings on Investments is income earned from financial investments



EXPENSES

Administration, direct services, funded services, contracted services, and other expenditures were \$1,460,297. Direct services at the Life Enrichment Center are funded by program revenue and county tax revenue. The chart below reflects expenditures for each specific category. Contracted Services include funding to Serve, Inc., Re-Made for a Purpose, and Callaway County Extended Employment. Other Contracted Services is funded services through Individual and Family Support and Partnership for Hope. All Contracted Services are funded by tax levy income.
